

# Throughout the Summer...

## Free Bike Fridays

Visit Governor's Island for Free Bike Fridays. On Fridays, Governor's Island is open from 10 am to 5 pm. The Ferry runs hourly between the Battery Maritime Building and Governors Island. The Bike and Roll™ rental kiosk is located immediately to the left after visitors disembark the Governor's Island Ferry. Visitors are also permitted to bring their own bikes from Friday – Sunday when the Island is open to the public.

## Central Park Activity Kits

Stop by one of the Park's Visitor Centers for a free activity kit, like a tote bag stuffed with Wiffle balls and bats, a Frisbee and a jump rope at North Meadow Recreation Center. Naturalists can go birding in the Ramble with the help of Belvedere Castle's Discovery Kit backpack, filled with binoculars, a bird guide, maps and a sketchpad. ## Bryant Park Film Festival

Bring a blanket or chair! The lawn opens at every Monday at 5 pm for blankets (plastic tarps are not allowed) and picnicking. The films begin at dusk (typically between 8 pm and 9 pm) at 42nd Street between 5th and 6th Avenues.

## Wave Hill Cultural Center

A spectacular 28-acre public garden and cultural center overlooking the Hudson River and Palisades in the Bronx, Wave Hill's vibrant landscape is one of the most beautiful spots in New York City. The Front Gate is at West 249th Street and Independence Avenue in the Bronx. Tuesday: Free all day during off-peak months (November–April, July & August) Tuesday: Free 9 am to 12 pm during peak months (May, June, September, October) Saturday: Free 9 am to 12 pm year-round

The **Teen Reviewers and Critics (TRaC)** program and **Freelance Writing Corps** offer teens the chance to explore NYC's culturescape, write about their experiences and publish their work on **The High 5 Review**, an interactive media hub fueled by teen arts coverage.

## Who can use High 5?

\$5 tickets (displayed on our newsletter and website) can be purchased by:

- \* Teens aged 13-18
- \* Students enrolled in grades 6-12
- \* Parents/accompanying adults of teens

**Please Note:** There must be a one-to-one ratio of teens and adults present at every High 5 event. So, if there is one adult there must be at least one teen, two adults, two teens and so forth.

## How does High 5 work?

High 5 tickets can be purchased on our website, over the phone or in our office.

When you arrive at the box office, **please bring your High 5 ticket voucher and proof of age/enrollment** for all teens. (This can be a school ID or report card.)
